Formal Consultation on the amalgamation of Scott- Broadwood Cafe Infant School and The Weald Cafe Primary School into a single academy

The Good Shepherd Trust (GST) is the authority for both The Weald and Scott-Broadwood schools. 'Due to pressing financial concerns and the over-resourcing of the two sites for the number of pupils they serve, the GST is considering amalgamating the two schools. GST has considered various options within this proposal: becoming a single academy rather than two, consolidating education at The Weald site, and sharing more roles across the two schools. Both schools face financial challenges that, if left unaddressed, could threaten their viability in the coming years.' *letter to stakeholders, parents, carers, from Paul Kennedy CEO The Good Shepherd Trust.*

So the GST is seeking to amalgamate the two schools and has begun the formal process, following an earlier informal process involving staff, parents and members of the schools' local governing committee, to potentially move the pupils from Scott-Broadwood to take up places at The Weald School. The formal process of consultation began this last week on July 2nd and will end at 12pm on July 24th. This in effect means that Scott-Broadwood School could close as early as the beginning of next year if the Dept of Education (DfE) decide that these plans can go ahead. Stakeholders' views are important to this process so there will be an informal stakeholders meeting on Monday 8th July at The Weald School 6.30pm. This is obviously a very sad move for all who live and work in Capel. Please pray for those who are called to respond and we will issue more details next week on individual or group responses to the potential closure.
